## Earn cash from your unwanted items

Spring is here, traditionally a time for major cleaning. Survey your home, yard, and lot. Is it time to rake those pine needles, thin some trees, or clear away debris? Do you have furniture or old cars you have been meaning to dispose of? With the sixth annual **Project Clean Sweep**, the City of Show Low can help you clean and beautify your home. You also could earn some fast cash through **Cash for Trash**.

The **Project Clean Sweep** program includes a variety of services, explained below, in April, May and June. Proof of Show Low residency is required to participate in the program. Citizens must show either a current utility statement or a valid driver's license listing a street address.

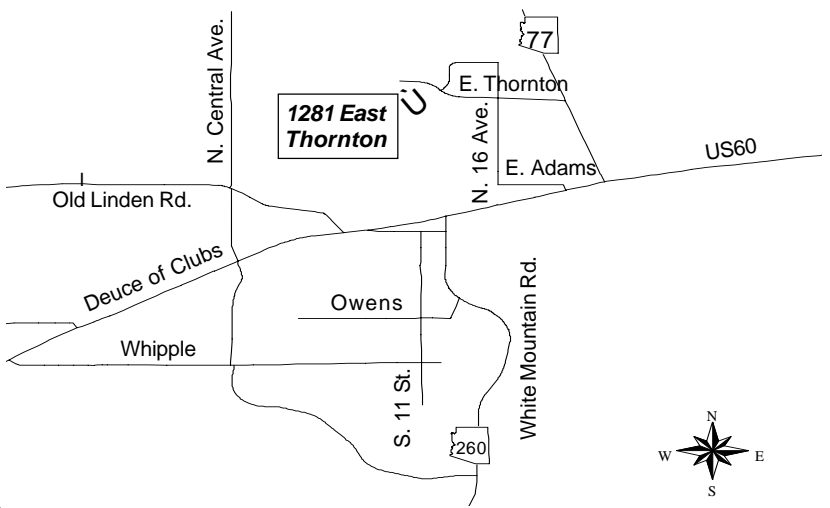
- o **Volunteer cleanup.** City employees helped clean the Deuce of Clubs and the downtown area in late April, removing weeds and debris.
- o **"Cash for Trash."** Residents will be paid cash for delivering large, unwanted items to a City facility.
- o **Free excess garbage collection.** The City has contracted with Waste Management to pick up excess trash – for free.
- o **Free bulky item pickup service.** Sign up for this free service provided by City employees.
- o **Dumpster placement.** Dumpsters will be placed at City Hall and the Elks Lodge for use by residents.

**"Cash for Trash"** is scheduled for Saturday, May 15, 2004. Residents may take large items for disposal to the building next to the City's Public Works yard at 1281 East Thornton. You will be paid cash for each item

## Get out and vote on May 18

Voters will go to the polls again and cast their votes for Show Low's new mayor and three City Council seats. The General Election is Tuesday, May 18, 2004 in the City Hall Council Chambers, 200 West Cooley. The polls will be open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Until May 7, voters may request that an early ballot be mailed to a specified address by calling the City Clerk's office at 532-4060 or the Navajo County Elections Department at (800) 668-3867.

If you miss the deadline, you will have to vote in person. Voted early ballots may be (1) mailed back to Navajo County (mail it by May 14 or it may not reach the county in time), (2) dropped off at the City Clerk's office, or (3) taken to the polling place on election day.

Voters will see two candidates' names on the General Election ballot for Mayor – John Corder and Rick Fernau. Voters will choose from six names on the ballot for the three Council seats – Michael Aroner, Gordon Kearn, Darrell Purcell, Daryl Seymore, Michael Sipes, and Gerry Whipple. The candidates elected at the General Election will take their seats at the June 1, 2004 regular Council meeting, which begins at 6 p.m., in the City Council Chambers.

accepted. (A list of items and prices is shown below, but no commercial waste items will be accepted.)

Automobile tires will also be taken, although residents will receive no money in return. Each customer is limited to a maximum of eight tires.

The City will accept inoperable vehicles and pay \$25 for those with titles and \$15 for those without titles. The City will provide free towing, but advance reservations must be made by calling David Franson at 532-4042 or Carson Harris at 532-4051.

**Free excess garbage collection** will be provided the week of June 7 through 11, 2004, a quarterly service contracted by the City with Waste Management. Only those residents who are billed for City water and/or sewer services receive this benefit. Waste Management will collect excess trash bags under 50 pounds each and items up to four feet long (that must be bound if there's more than one item), placed next to the polycarts on a resident's normally scheduled pickup day.

For those residents who have not participated in the "Cash for Trash" program but have unwanted, heavy items to get rid of, the City offers **free bulky item pickup service**. It is scheduled for June 14 through 18, 2004. City employees will visit households that have made an appointment by calling 532-4042 or 532-4051. Please include your name, address and telephone number if you leave a message.

**Dumpsters** will be placed at City Hall on Cooley and the Elks Lodge on Whipple from June 17 through 19, 2004.
