Project Clean Sweep program kicks off in June

The seventh annual **Project Clean Sweep**, sponsored by the City of Show Low, can help you clean and beautify your home and yard. You could even earn some fast cash through *Cash for Trash*.

The entire **Project Clean Sweep** program will be conducted in June. Proof of Show Low residency is required to take advantage of the services. Citizens must show either a current utility statement or a valid driver's license listing a street address.

A general description of the services is shown below, followed by detailed program information.

- **"Cash for Trash."** Residents will earn cash for delivering large items to the City's public works yard.

- **Free excess garbage collection.** Waste Management will pick up excess trash on a household's regular trash day.

- **Bulky item pickup service.** City employees will haul away bulky items for residents that called in a request.

- **Green waste drop-off.** Residents can take green waste to a drop-off site—and pay no dumping fees.

- **Dumpster placement.** Dumpsters will be placed at the public works yard for use by residents.

EXCESS TRASH PICKUP (June 6–10)
Free excess trash collection by Waste Management is available to residents billed for City water and/or sewer services. Place excess trash bags under 50 pounds each and items up to four feet long (bound if there is more than one item) next to the polycarts on your normally scheduled pickup day. Items for pickup may not be placed at curbside or in the street's right-of-way until the June 11-12 weekend.

Show Low library: On the move!

The much-anticipated move to the new library is just around the corner. New shelving, furniture and other library accessories have been ordered and installation is imminent. If all goes well, the library will be moved into the facility at 180 North 9th Street, formerly the Frontier (communications) building, by the end of June.

The library will occupy the building's first floor, featuring separate reading and study areas for adults, young adults and children, as well as an enlarged reference section and the computer lab. Plans include a large circulation desk, employee offices and work areas. Also included is a specially designated area for the Show Low Library Friends, called the "Garden of Readin'."

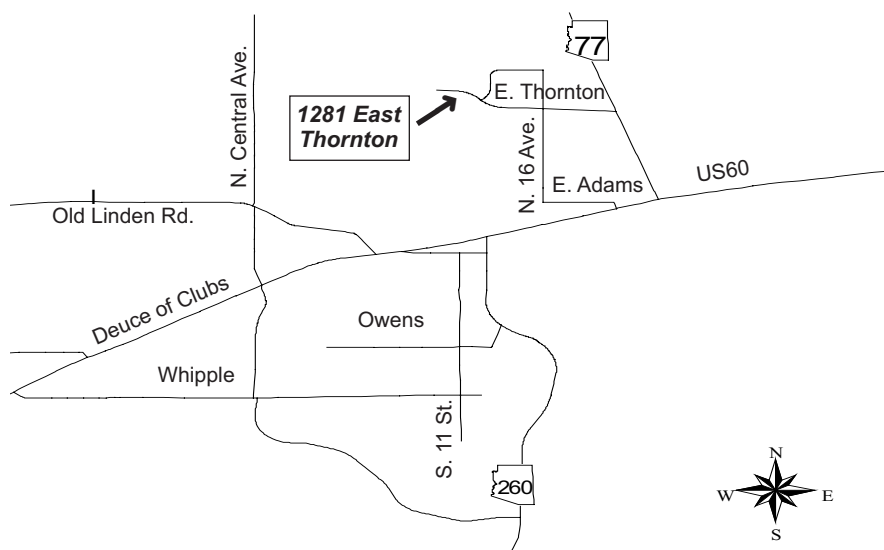
The new computer lab will have a total of 24 computers. They will be arranged facing the same direction, rather than along the wall. The OPACs (online computer catalog) will be scattered throughout the library, allowing patrons to access them from several locations.

Upstairs will house an employee lunchroom and two conference rooms, which will be used for a variety of library programs, including puppet shows, family-related activities and other community meetings and events. As yet, options for the balance of the upstairs floor have not been determined but may include the

BULKY ITEM PICKUP (June 13–17)

During the week of June 13 to 17 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., City employees and volunteers will collect bulky items from residents who arranged a pickup. Only large items, such as bulky appliances and furniture, are eligible for this service. Bags, boxes, bundles and piles of small garbage will not be accepted. These types of items may be taken to the dumpsters at the City's public works yard from June 13 through 18.

The City will not accept any hazardous materials, including liquid paints, oils, pesticides, herbicides and household cleaning products. In addition, the City will not accept tree trunks, branches, pine needles and grass. If you do not schedule a pickup in advance, any bulky items left for collection will be picked up by Waste Management for a charge of \$20 per item. These charges, if incurred, will be added to the residence's June 2005 utility bill.

To make an appointment, call 532-4100 no later than June 9. If you leave a message, include your name, physical address, telephone number and a list of the items for pickup. All bulky items scheduled for pickup must be placed next to the curb in front of the residence the weekend of June 11 and 12.

GREEN WASTE DROP-OFF (June 13–18)

This is a new service provided at no cost to homeowners. Residents may take tree trunks, limbs, branches, grass and pine needles to the green waste facility at First Knoll, near the Perkins cinder pit. These items will no longer be accepted at the dumpsters placed at the public works yard. The facility's hours of operation are 9 a.m. through 3 p.m. Monday through Friday, June 13 to 17, and 7 a.m. through noon on Saturday, June 18.

CASH FOR TRASH (June 13–18)

Residents may take large items for disposal to the public works yard, 1281 East Thornton, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., June 13 to 17, and 8 a.m. until noon on Saturday, June 18. You will be paid cash for each item accepted. A list of items and prices is shown in the box to the right. No commercial waste items will be accepted.

Automobile tires will be accepted, although residents receive no money in return. The limit is a maximum eight tires.

The City will accept and dispose of inoperable or unwanted vehicles, automobiles and pickup trucks up to three-quarter ton in size, paying \$25 for those with titles and \$15 for those without titles.

The City will provide free towing, using the services of Show Low Auto. Residents wishing to have their inoperable vehicles towed must provide an Abandoned Vehicle form (one per vehicle). Forms are available at the Department of Motor Vehicles or the public works yard at 1281 East Thornton.

To complete the Abandoned Vehicle form, fill out the back side of the yellow copy. The owner must sign the form and include a telephone number for scheduling a pickup. (Show Low Auto will contact each owner directly.) The form MUST be completed prior to 4 p.m., June 17, 2005. Return it to Cari Bilbie, Public Works Yard, 1281 East Thornton, Show Low, AZ 85901.

DUMPSTERS (June 13–18)

The City has contracted with Waste Management to place dumpsters at the

public works yard, 1281 East Thornton, from Monday, June 13, through noon on Saturday, June 18. Unlike previous years, no dumpsters will be placed at City Hall and the Elks Lodge.

The dumpsters are for Show Low residents only. Residents will be asked to provide identification, so bring a current utility statement or valid driver's license that displays a street address.

The City will not accept debris and materials from construction sites, commercial refuse or hazardous materials. Green waste, such as grass clippings, pine needles, leaves, tree trunks and limbs, also will not be accepted.

Automobile tires and old car batteries must be placed next to the dumpsters, not in them. The dumpsters will be monitored by City employees to ensure compliance.

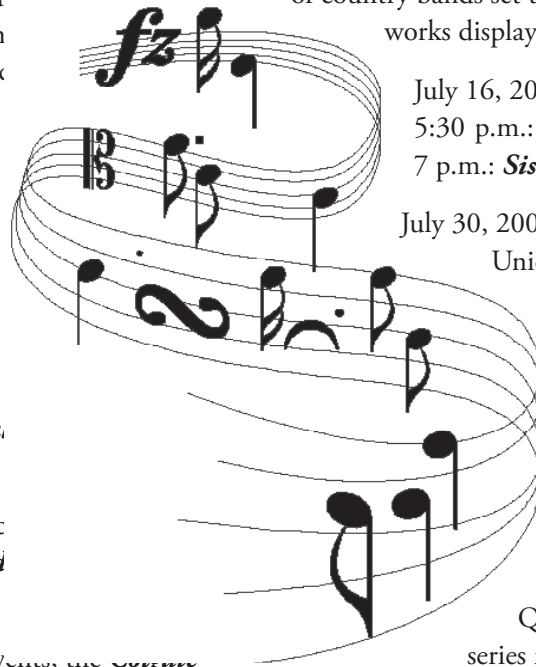

possible relocation of several City departments.

The library's main telephone number, 532-4070, will not change.

Library hours will remain Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Wednesday, noon to 8 p.m.; and Saturday, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., until the upstairs portion is used.

The Show Low Fire District purchased the existing library for administrative offices. Its current administrative offices will be renovated to accommodate another truck bay. The portable building housing the current computer lab will be sold by the City and moved to another location.
